What we are learning about:

Numeracy



<u>Mental Maths</u>

This term we will be focusing on multiplication and division. It would be helpful to practice timetables with your children to help build their confidence in recalling timetable facts.

Numeracy

This term we will be focusing on measurement, money and time. We will be learning to use a range of instruments to estimate and compare length, capacity, weight and area. We are learning to pay for and give change for goods up to £10. We are also learning to tell the time to five minute intervals.

Reading

We will be continuing to focus on reading with increasing fluency and expression. As well as using the before, during and after reading strategies. Note taking will be a focus to help our listening and comprehension skills.

Literacy

<u>Writing</u>

This term we will be focusing on creating information reports and persuasive writing. We will be looking at how we can up-level our writing.

Religious Education

In RE this term we have been remembering loved ones during the month of all souls and learning about God's role in helping people through difficult times. We will be learning about Advent and revisiting the story of the Nativity.

Things to remember...
